Case study

On Sunday Jamie noticed a tent had been put up in the entrance to the park by her house. Until today, she didn't know who was sleeping there, but on her walk this morning Jamie sees a woman tidying up in the tent, alone. She walks quickly past, not wanting to stare and heads to work. As she walks past, she scolds herself; why didn't she offer her a warm drink or a sandwich?

The next day Jamie builds up the confidence to say 'good morning' as she walks to work and silently promises herself to drop a coffee off to the lady on her way home, but as she approaches the park, Jamie notices that there are police officers and a paramedic helping the woman who has a nasty cut above her eye. Someone had tried to steal something from her tent and when she tried to stop them, they punched her. Not wanting to stop and stare, she left the coffee on the floor and walked home.

Jamie sometimes struggles with anxiety but knows that the woman in the tent will be feeling much worse. She worries about how lonely and isolated she must feel and reflects on how frightening it must be to not know where your next meal will come from.
