

Judges' criteria

You'll see the judges' criteria below. 50% of the marks are awarded for the social action your class has done and 50% of the marks are awarded for the presentation itself.

This is what the judges will be looking at when they watch the presentations at the Final, so it's really important that you keep the criteria below in mind when planning your presentation:

Have you emailed, met or talked with the charity/ representative? Even if you didn't hear back, still tell the judges you tried.

Did you raise any money? How did you raise awareness?

What did you do for your social action?

What skills and talents did you and your group/class members use to raise awareness or money for the charity?

Have you included your plans to continue your relationship with and support of the charity?

Can you show that you linked your social issue to your social action?

What did you think went well with your social action plans? What could you have done better?

Think about including something that will make your presentation different to the other class/year group presentations.

What does the charity do? How do they help people?

If you were to win the £1000 grant for your charity, what would the charity do with the money?

Use your skills to make your presentation stand out!

Good at art? Paint a picture.
Are you a poet? Write a poem about your social issue!
Musical? Compose/perform a song!
