

Quick links for Class Teachers

In addition to the full scheme of work, a digital version of the coursebook and lesson PowerPoint slides available on the [Teacher Hub](#), we have plenty of additional resources available to support your delivery of First Give. Before each lesson we recommend taking a look at the relevant folder on the Hub, including each lesson's short briefing video, to fully prepare.

New for 2026-27 is our [Student Hub](#). This is a student-facing one-page resource directory to support groups with their social action projects and presentations. It is not a mandatory resource, relying on student initiative to maximise its potential, and does not replace any of the teacher-led programme. We recommend sharing the Student Hub with students near the beginning of their First Give journey, and hope it will prove useful, particularly with older students.

- ◆ **[Programme tracker for teachers](#)** – A shared space to provide updates on the progress of your class. We recommend asking your Lead Teacher to ensure this is set up as a live document and shared with the team.
- ◆ **[Tutor Time breakdown](#)** – this breaks the lessons down to shorter chunks and emphasises the absolute red lines of each. Ideal for squeezed deliveries regardless of the circumstances.
- ◆ **[Social Action Ideas Matrix](#)** – To help your class think about how they can meaningfully link their social action to their social issue and consider the potential impact of their work, we have created a PowerPoint presentation here with a variety of ideas that you can use to inspire your students.
- ◆ **[Charity contact guidance](#)** – It can feel disappointing if your class is unable to get in touch with their chosen charity. We have created a guidance document with tips to support your class if their charity is unresponsive or not available for a meeting. Please also remember to reach out to your Programme Manager at First Give for support.
- ◆ **[Catch-up sheets](#)** – We know time is at a premium in school, so if students miss a lesson we have our handy student-led catch-up one-pagers. This means you can concentrate on teaching the lesson you are working on, and no student misses out.
- ◆ **[Late-programme activities](#)** – If you're committing a lesson or more to helping the School Final presentation group ready themselves, here are other light-touch activities to engage the rest of the class and support their peers at the Final.
